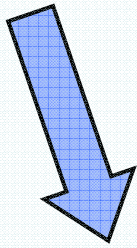

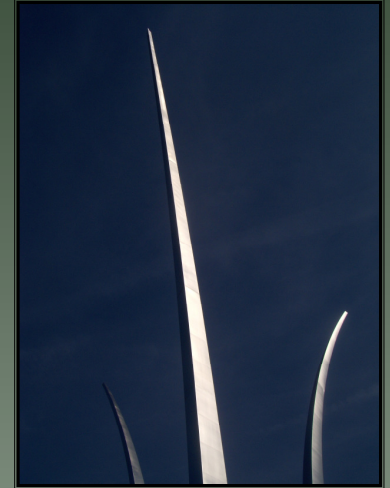
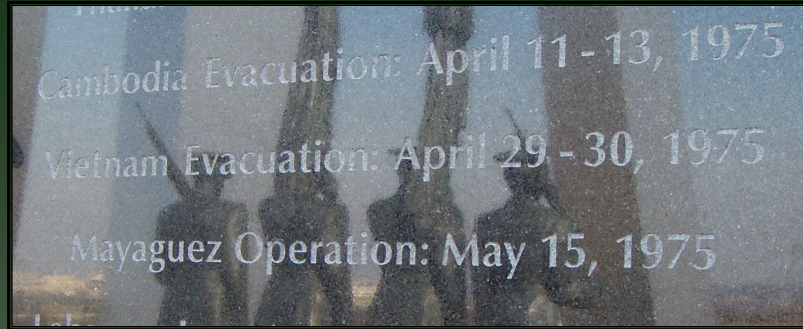

Calling All Koh Tang Vets

Back in August of 2008 there was a posting to the Koh Tang Guest Book from Author Scott Baron informing us he was writing a chapter of a book about the Cold War for the Naval Institute. The chapter was to be about The Battle of Koh Tang / Mayaguez Rescue Mission. Several Koh Tang vets contacted Scott and he soon realized he had much more than a chapter on his hands. Several of us have read the chapter that was going to be published and it is very good. He does not have a political agenda. He and the Naval Institute want the story, our story, told. The following is Scott Baron's request in his words.

To the veterans of Koh Tang

My name is Scott Baron, and along with Capt. James Wise Jr., am writing a book for the Naval Institute Press on the Battle of Koh Tang. Originally planned as a chapter in a forthcoming book on the Cold War, the chapter will serve as an outline for a more comprehensive exploration of the events occurring prior to, during, and following the battle in May 1975. Below is the proposal for the book sent to the Naval Institute which was approved; **my contract is SIGNED and the book WILL be out early 2011.**

PROPOSAL

THE 16 HOUR WAR – Valor on Koh Tang and the Rescue of the Mayaguez

The below authors propose to write a book entitled The Sixteen Hour War – Valor on Koh Tang and the Rescue of the Mayaguez. This book will be a comprehensive examination of the efforts by US Marines, Sailors and Airmen, one of the earliest Joint-Service operations, to rescue the crew of the SS Mayaguez, seized by the Cambodians on the high seas in May 1975. Although it occurred more than two years after the capitulation of South Vietnam, it is considered the last action of the Vietnam War, and the names of those killed are the final names on the Vietnam Memorial.

Although other books have focused on the decisions of the commanders, the actions of the crew of the Mayaguez, and the efforts of the helicopter pilots in effecting the recovery of the rescue force, no book has yet been written detailing the heroic efforts of the Marines on the ground who went in to rescue the crew and recapture the ship.

Although a force of Marines, most of whom were 18-19 year olds who had never seen combat, was sent onto a Cambodian island expecting to encounter resistance from 20-30 irregular militia, what they found instead was a force of 600-800 veteran combat troops supported by heavy weapons. Plagued by incorrect and incomplete intelligence and a cumbersome Command and Control component, which extended all the way to the Oval Office, the Marines found that the difficulty of getting onto the island was exceeded only by the near impossible task of getting off. Their success is a testament to their tenacity and fighting spirit.

The book will be written with the support and collaboration of the Koh Tang Beach Club, an association comprised of Koh Tang veterans and will include first-hand accounts of the battle in their own words. Included will be recollections by 2Lt. James McDaniel, among the first Marines ashore who was awarded the Navy Cross, Lt. Robert Blough, a pilot of one of the extraction helicopters, Tom Noble, a sailor aboard Black Velvet-1, the captain's gig which provided off-shore fire support, LtCol. Randall Austin, the ground force commander, Cpt. James Davis, Golf Company commander, 2Lt. Dan Hoffman, a platoon commander, GySgt Francis McGowin, the regimental intelligence officer, Fred Morris and Al Bailey, Marines on the ground, and many others. The story will be told by the men who were there.

The purpose of the book will be to bring to light an event long overlooked by historians and unknown by the general public, and to acknowledge the valor of young inexperienced Marines who successfully fought a superior and entrenched enemy force under unanticipated conditions to complete their objective.

We are especially interested in interviewing Marines located on the East Beach, and those who went down aboard Knife-31, pilots and crew of the aircraft, but am interested in any untold stories.

Those interested can begin by compiling a brief biography of their experiences both before (birth, education, prior service, etc) and subsequent to (career, marriage, kids) the battle, as well as recollections of the action itself. This will serve as a basis for subsequent telephone interviews

Since the intent is to relate events hour-by-hour (16 hour war) it will be useful if you can recall times thing occurred (as well as 30 plus years memories permit). Those interested can either advise Fred Morris or contact me directly at SBARON7827@aol.com or call me at (831) 761-3209.

VFW Mayaguez Memorial Post #11575

Post 11575 History: The VFW Post 11575 was established on 15 May 2000, under a Charter issued by The Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States and signed by the Commander in Chief, John Smart. The Post was started with 42 active members that are listed on the Post Charter.

Post Name and Number: The Post was named in memory of 18 KIA, 3 MIA and 41 wounded servicemen during the Mayaguez Incident. The Post Number, 11575, was selected in memory of the date (11 May 75) that the Mayaguez Containership was seized by Khmer Rouge forces. I know that the date was actually 12 May but this is what I was told when I joined the Post. It may have been an error when the number was requested.

Post News: We had a great Memorial Day BBQ. We co-hosted the BBQ with AMCHAM and had the US Ambassador in attendance along with approximately 70 visitors. We had members of an Army Reserve Unit from Utah also attend as they had just finished providing some training here in-country.

We are also currently planning the Fun 4th of July Party. The party will be held on the 4th at the US Embassy and will be co-hosted by Post 11575 and the AMCHAM. We have 1300 tickets for sale and are expecting nearly 1000 attendees. The VFW will be partnering with the Marine Detachment to sell beer and polo shirts.

We will have a live band, circus performers and 20 vendors, seven different food vendors, including two US franchises--KFC and Swenson's. The Marines will also provide the color guard detail. It's not much but we try to do our small part.

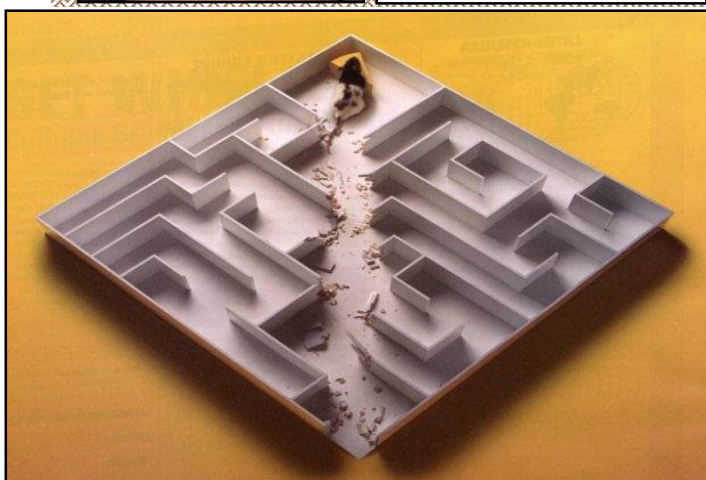
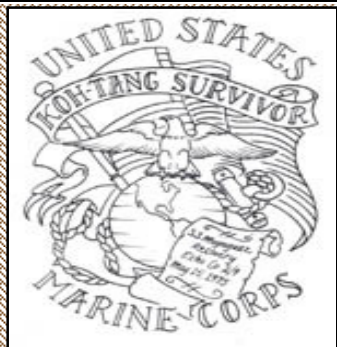
